Stop motion is an animation technique in which a camera is repeatedly stopped and started, frame-by-frame, in order to give inanimate objects and figures the impression of movement. Any medium is acceptable for the inanimate objects. Using Stop motion apps like Lego Stop Motion is acceptable.

A maximum of two entries per category is allowed. Footage must be submitted in MP4 format. Up to 2 minutes. No longer than 2 minutes.
